Executive Director

Giving Kitchen provides emergency assistance to food service workers through financial assistance and connection to community resources.

At the heart of our mission, we offer food service workers dignity, opportunity and stability.

Dignity by making sure food service workers know they matter, they are valued, and they are important. Opportunity by providing visits with doctors, dentists, counselors, and therapists, and stability by providing financial assistance and connections through our community resource referral program to help with housing, hunger prevention, and substance misuse.

In 2022 Giving Kitchen provided 4,262 referrals and \$2,136,359 in financial aid. Of the 11,477 food service workers we have helped since inception, 25% were served in 2022.

We shared loud and proud that food service workers provide “vital services” far beyond a pandemic.

Thank you for making this work possible.

Letter from Jen Hidingen-Kendrick

Founder

I have hope for Giving Kitchen. A food service worker asked for help from Giving Kitchen every 90 minutes in 2022. Someone experiencing a crisis out of their control; a broken ankle, an apartment fire, a miscarriage, a mental health collapse, a husband dying of cancer. Every hour and a half someone needed help to make sure they weren't evicted or their children potentially homeless, our team was able to help with resources and financial support because of YOU.

It is because of your belief in Giving Kitchen that we can make an impact in the lives of food services workers everywhere. In 2022, GK pushed its efforts in recognizing that national expansion was on the horizon. We enhanced our technologies and systems, we grew our staff (7 new teammates just in 2022) and we started opening the gate for all food service workers to ask for help from Giving Kitchen, coast-to-coast.

I love to acknowledge our accomplishments (*Fast Company's* Brands That Matter accolade in 2022), but I am more inspired by our future.

Already in 2023, we have seen an exponential growth over last year. More clients requesting help, more stories being told, more eyes on Giving Kitchen. And when I think of our future, I have hope that the work we do will not be lost, but carried forward, because of the impact GK has on the lives of those who serve us every day.

I am constantly inspired by the resilience and courage of food service workers to ask for help. I am equally inspired by the support of our community, which has allowed GK to continue to support our mission to meet crisis with compassion and care.

Thank you for joining the ride, and here's to helping more food service workers nationwide for years to come. As my late husband put into words, “Anything long lasting or worthwhile takes time and complete surrender.” Here's to nurturing that commitment.

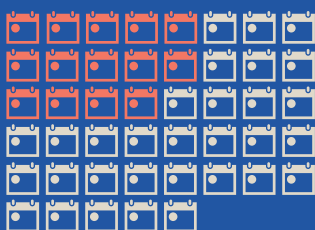

My story ↓

Marla has been working in the food service industry for 35 years. When her husband, Chris, had a stroke, Giving Kitchen stepped in to provide assistance to her family so they were able to focus on his health. Their family did not worry about basic living expenses that were adding up while she was missing some work to care for him. Here is her story:

“In June of 2022, my husband Chris had a severe stroke and brain hemorrhage, and he suffered permanent brain damage. My 17-year-old son and I would hang on to every moment he squeezed our hand or wiggled his toes on command. I missed so much work and my husband obviously could no longer work, and the rent and all the bills got very behind. While we were trying to cope and be there for my husband, we had eviction hanging over our heads.

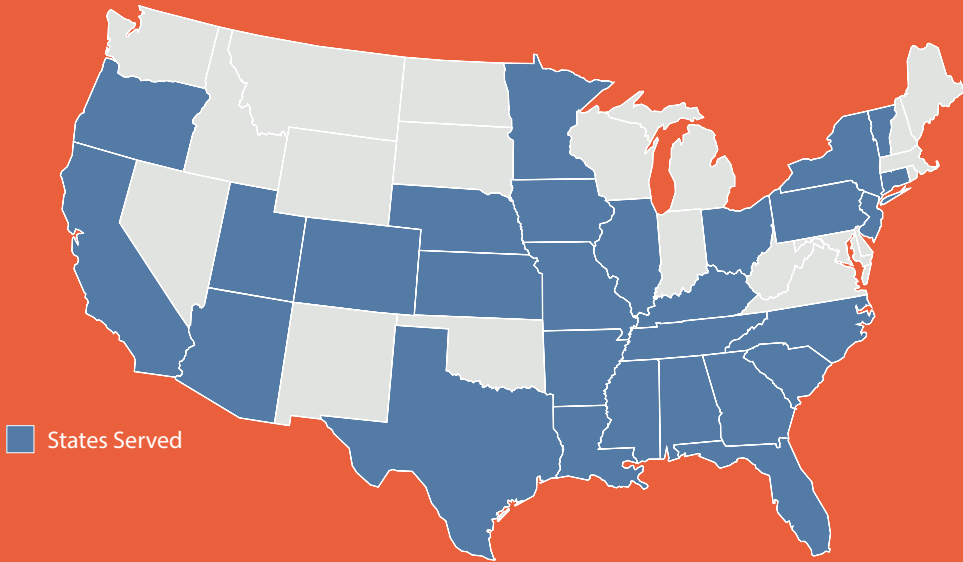
The Vice-President of Human Resources for my company came into my restaurant to eat breakfast and my coworkers told her my story, she asked me for my phone number and called me the next day with information about Giving Kitchen. I filled out the application on the website and within a week a social worker called me and within the same week I got an email saying I was APPROVED!!! I was so very grateful and relieved, now my son and I could focus on my husband Chris and didn't have to worry about becoming homeless while all of this is happening. I can't even find enough good things to say about this organization and their workers thank you to my social worker and everyone at Giving Kitchen!!! You saved us.”

Giving Kitchen was able to provide Marla with four months of rent and electric bills. Donors like you helped keep Marla and her family from facing eviction in a time of severe crisis.

I was so very grateful and relieved, now my son and I could focus on my husband Chris and didn't have to worry about becoming homeless while all of this is happening.

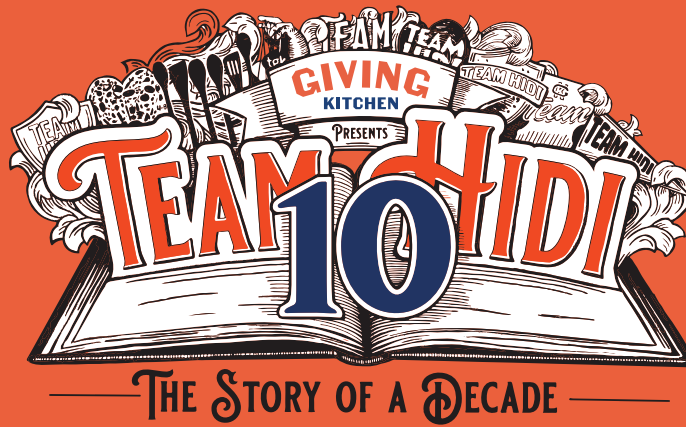

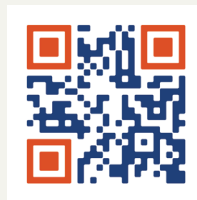
